

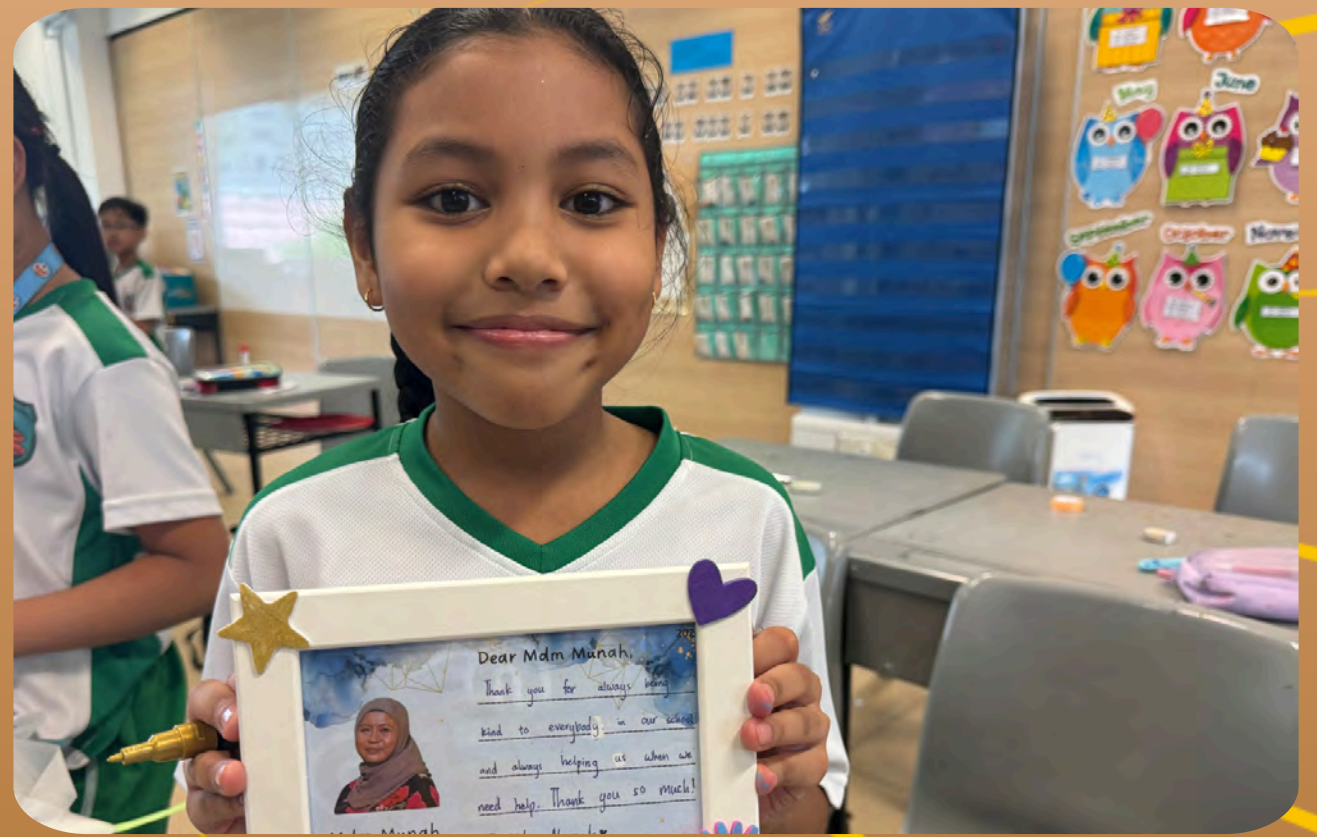
EXPERIENCING WGPS
